- Pastor Doug wanted to address old business. Particularly he chose to start with the 2022 Pastoral Search Committee. Resumes are submitted to Pastor Doug, the district or the church directly. The resumes are then forwarded to the committee. They prepare questions or note observations. And then discuss further at the meeting before deciding whether to interview a candidate. We used the surveys distributed last year to create our primary goals. When we decide we would like more information, they are sent an eight page pastor information form as it goes in a lot more depth than a resume would. If we choose to continue, all the references are followed up upon with a three page telephone interview (which has produced a variety of results). If those

■ are acceptable it proceeds to zoom interview, then to a personal interview. We've received 15 resumes from within Canada and many more from abroad. (which are generally promptly dismissed as we specified that applicants must be Canadian citizens or have permanent Canadian citizenship). All candidates are 100% confidential in order to protect the applicant. 4 candidates withdrew their applications after receiving the pastoral information form. We met 10 times specific to reviewing candidates. It's been emotional, challenging, exhausting but we are united in seeking God's best. This church has not sought a pastor in 30 years which is an added challenge. We trust that the congregation will have patience with us and trust us in the process. We're trusting in 2023 that God will reveal His perfect will for our congregation.

■ MOVING ONTO NEW BUSINESS:

Proposed resolution to bylaw 3.5 quorum to increase quorum from 25% to 40%. Dave Olsen asked if this was a local change or national change. He also asked what prompted the change. Rev Hope shared that specifically in response to searching for a pastor – we felt that it was important that we require a higher percentage of the voting membership to constitute a quorum. Garry Hill moved, Ed Esopenko seconded, M/S/C

Diana asked for further clarification regarding a proxy vote for if you had to be away from the meeting. One proxy vote will be allowed as per our constitutional amendment circa 2022 annual meeting.

Ann-Marie asked whether this was specific to the board election, or to every congregational voting. She followed up that question with asking what makes a person inactive and how they become active again. There wasn't a very specific list as far as timing, but to re-activate membership there should be attendance and financial support for a minimum of three months. Item to be followed up by church board.

Vote regarding resolution - M/S/C

■ UPCOMING PROJECTS:

- The canopy out front is "not desirable". Randy took the microphone and shared the vision to remove all the stucco from the canopy, and above and below the windows and update it with siding. Possibly upgrading the lighting and adding a sign on the front.
- We've talked about painting. Invited an interior designer for her input. Talked about how long it's been since painting and how great a fresh coat of paint looks. The project is currently out for quote and will be done in phases.
- 3. Outreach. Invited Cathy Crane to the microphone. Working to set up shelving and bins with items available such as socks, scarves, clothing, toothbrushes, food and operate as some what of a distribution center. Hoping to have a couple hours of week staffed by volunteers and also pre-pack bags with essentials to be distributed to members of the congregation so that they can be given out to those less fortunate.

- 4. Pastor Doug shared his plan that in 2023 he would like each department head to come up with an outreach event or strategy that will be carried out by the end of the year. He plans to meet each department head over the course of the next month to plant the seed and get a commitment.
- 5. 100th Anniversary this year in October 2023. Pastor Doug shared that we have a committee but it's small and would welcome more members. We have also been unable to locate many of the photos that were used in the 75th Anniversary book so we are looking for especially old photos. If you have any, please bring them in. It was originally slated for the Thanksgiving weekend, but after receiving some feedback it has been moved to the following week. Ann-Marie asked who is on the committee. So far it is Diana Wooden, Mary Campbell, Cathy Crane and Pastor Doug. If you are interested in volunteering, please see one of those people.
- There will be an election tonight. Pastor Doug read the constitution regarding voting. He asked Karen Esopenko and Marv Sinitoski to count the ballots. Those present were instructed to select three of the five names and be sure to not spoil their ballot.

There were 20 nomination ballots cast, 13 nominated, 9 who qualified.

Cathy Crane took the microphone to say a huge thank you to everyone who contributed to the Christmas feast this last year. That meal fed over 700 people at the school, Homeward Bound and on the street. It would not have been possible without the volunteers from our church and Cathy was so proud to share they were from Crossroads.

Rey sang a Broadway musical while the votes were counted.

Cathy asked for some additional volunteers to help move the stages back to the garage.

First ballot election – Rey Idmilao, Khami Chokani and Mary Campbell. As per the percentage of votes, Rey will receive a one-year term. Khami and Mary will each receive three year terms.



I sat and reread a lot of last years ministry reports as I collected my thoughts on what was important to highlight and celebrate over the previous year. Shortly after our last AGM, Rev. Hope made the difficult decision to discontinue his interim leadership at Crossroads. We continue to be so grateful for everything he invested in getting Crossroads ready for a new leader. I spoke to Pastor Doug recently and he and Cindy are doing well and enjoying retirement to the fullest. With no interim leader in place, our PAOC District Superintendent, Rev. Paul Israelson, became the chair of Crossroads board and appointed district coach, Rev. Louis Halbgewachs, to lead the amended Pastoral Search Committee. Instead of searching for a new interim lead, we relied on weekly pulpit supply which was primarily covered by Rev. Matt Bombay and Rev. Josh Singh of Southpoint Church in Saskatoon, and Rev. It was a fancy name to say, the designated person to go ask if you need anything. Information about what's going on in the church – Mary would know. Coordinate volunteers to meet a need? Mary would happily spend hours on the phone doing just that and always knew precisely who to call. Mary organized weekly prayer time and devotions with Marivic and myself

during our time of transition and dedicated many hours to lifting our church and our church family in prayer. She resigned her position at the end of May 2023. LIBRARY



Technology Report

LEDSIGN UPDATE

We have been encountering problems with our ledsign for several years now. Like any other computerized equipment our sign is getting old. Some of the common issues that we usually have are the following: the screen is all blue, a slide freezes, or the date/time/temp slide is not functioning properly. And last year was actually quite frustrating having problems with our sign three months in a row (twice in January, then months of March and April). Our ledsign is being serviced remotely by Craig Tobin our tech support in Calagary, he is the Tech Support Supervisor of Genoptic Smart Displays assigned to us. If rebooting the ledsign computer on my end won't fix it, I give Craig a call and he will fix the problem on his end. But he did point out that our sign computer is getting old and we should consider upgrading it.

So, I asked Chelsey to ask her brother Kyle Erickson, an IT expert, to come and check our sign computer. According to Kyle, same as what Craig told us that our led sign computer is quite old in computer years but Kyle did identify the battery issue. He noted the type of battery required and has it on his list to replace the next time he comes to the church. The battery is too weak to hold the reboot data so the date resets to the factory date (earlier than our data exists). He could additionally plug a keyboard in and show us how to change the date back without Craig's assistance.

Last October 19, 2023, the same issue happened, the date/time/temp slide was not functioning properly. The temperature was not being displayed – only the date and time was showing. When I informed Craig about the error, he said that it was showing properly on his end and might have just temporarily lost the temperature value. It also shows on his end that it was

working and switching ads too. And these things are likely going to keep happening unless the sign's computer is replaced. He also added that the temperature reading relies on a weather feed. When the weather feed is not available it stops displaying. Ours is a very outdated software and is no longer supported so there is not much he can do. The temperature might come back if it is related to the weather feed. If we would like to have the most recent version of software, they already have moved to a new platform which is licensed. The computer system would need to be upgraded as the current computer is running Windows 7 which is also not supported any longer. This time the costs to upgrade would be around \$3000. (\$1250 for the software license on a 10 year term and \$1750 for a new computer). Right now, just one slide is not properly working - which is the date/time/temp slide and the rest are working. So if it doesn't bother anyone, I suggest that we leave it that way until such time that we decide to invest and have it upgraded. We will keep you all posted.

In 2023, we focused our efforts on addressing a couple of smaller items and consulting with professionals to establish the best plan for positioning ourselves technologically moving forward. A few of the smaller things we were able to address was adding a powered shock protecting plug to the main office that services our photocopier and main network. In the event of a power surge, this valuable equipment now ought to be well protected from any unintended side effects and there is additionally a built in battery backup to prevent the equipment from going offline.

There has been further consulting with two different IT experts as to the best way to expand and protect our computer networks. Choosing the most effective solution and executing it are planned for the coming year. In the sanctuary, we were able to invest in upgrading the main keyboard and in the soundroom we were able to upgrade the noise cancelling headphones which is a vital piece of equipment for providing a positive experience on our live stream. Planned for 2024 is replacing a few of our aging microphones.

In 2023, one of the companies we work with for our Sunday morning presentation software changed their licensing agreement in a way that compromised our ability to be flexible on Sunday mornings. Our choices were to sign up for yet another subscription agreement to restore functionality or switch providers. Marivic invested many hours in sampling alternative options. We are currently continuing to operate with our original provider but will be making a change early in 2024. There will likely be no discernable change to congregants, but it will require some additional training for those who serve in PowerPoint ministry.

We continue to work in somewhat of a rotation as far as updating our computers. In January of 2024, we purchased a new computer for the pastors office and are also checking into adding some additional data storage to the main office computer.

Other planned technology changes for 2024 include moving our website to a new host and making a few adjustments to provide a better user experience for our congregants and potential guests. We'll be sure to highlight the changes once they go live and look forward to hearing your feedback.

Maintenance

In 2022, the board made significant improvements in a variety of areas around the church. Several key pieces of equipment were upgraded or replaced, storage was improved in several spaces, technology was upgraded, we updated some lighting and electrical, addressed some safety concerns by adding railings to the stage and safety outlets in all areas designated for children/youth and had our parking lot cleaned and repainted. This past year was comparatively quieter as far as projects completed, but we've done a lot of research and sought out advice and quotes from professionals for several projects being evaluated for future completion. As far as projects that were completed in 2023, they are going to feel slightly repetitive as they've been referred to in other reports.

Areas that were addressed in 2023 include,

- We purchased some additional storage accessories which are being utilized by multiple ministries in the church.
- We repaired our rooftop furnaces and the main water heater.
- We purchased a shock protector and battery backup for our main office equipment.
- Thanks to your generous donations, we now have 20 round tables which allow us to accommodate bigger groups of people in our gym.
- An AED machine was purchased and installed in the central part of the building.



 The nursery received some much-needed repairs in the form of mold remediation, and a beautiful face lift. The room looks bright, fresh, and inviting and we are trusting that the nursery is going to be an incredible hub of activity in our near future.

There are several suggestions as to which areas of the church are due to be addressed. A top priority for this spring is getting our water drainage addressed. Our down spouts from the roof are no longer effectively draining the water from snow melt and rain away from the building. We attempted a smaller intervention by adding extensions to our existing downspouts, but the ground has eroded away enough near the building that a large amount of water ends up running back and settling along the building. This was ultimately what caused the mold to occur in the nursery. We've already explored options such as backfilling the perimeter of the building with sand and dirt, or alternatively digging a trench and installing weeping tile around

the building. We are currently waiting for it to get a bit warmer and we will be consulting with one other professional before proceeding with the best long term solution.

Other outdoor areas that have been discussed is addressing our crumbling sidewalks and the pavement at the back of the church.

Inside the church, we are so grateful to have such a beautiful building to gather together and worship in. Hiring a new pastor has meant a fresh set of eyes to what is often easy to overlook in our home. You may have noticed a small shift in the way some spaces within the church are being utilized. We've evaluated giving some of the smaller spaces a little facelift with a fresh coat of paint.

There have been concerns raised about the functionality of some spaces – most notably, the kitchen and the main office. Some possible projects and improvements are being evaluated for those spaces as well.

It goes without saying, that each of these projects come with a price tag. There has been some money put aside, and there will be some upcoming fundraisers for capital improvements. The board remains committed to seeking wisdom from God and pacing the projects as the Lord provides.

THE ROLE OF USHERS IN CHURCH

An usher is a spiritual ambassador for the local church - God's ordained and organized body of believers. The usher serves as a "first representative" of Jesus Christ for a worship service.

In the Old Testament, Ushers in the tabernacle and temple were called doorkeepers. The psalmist understood the importance of ushers when he said,

For a day in thy courts is better than a thousand. I had rather be a doorkeeper in the house of my God, than to dwell in the tents of wickedness.

Psalms 84:10 KJV

One of the purposes of doorkeepers was to receive offerings from the people. The Bible says in II Kings chapter 22, "Go up to the high priest and have him get ready the money that has been brought into the temple of the Lord, which the doorkeepers have collected from the people."

In the New Testament, the disciples acted as ushers on many occasions. They directed people who came to hear Jesus speak or be touched by His healing hands. On one occasion, Jesus told the disciples to organize a large group of over 5,000. Jesus supplied the unending loaves and fishes, but the disciples served the hungry multitude as ushers.

Remember that preachers, teachers and musicians minister to people in groups while ushers minister to people as individuals. A word of encouragement or kindness may be the most significant ministry some people receive. Only a few people get to meet the pastor, ask questions, or talk with musicians, but everyone can have an encounter with a good usher.

When you serve as an usher, you set the stage for the worship experience. Your spiritual readiness and act of service plays a huge role in the life-change that takes place that day.

Before the church service starts, the ushers will often have the responsibility to check the thermostat, check the restrooms, and prepare the bulletins for distribution. As churchgoers arrive, the ushers will act as doorkeepers, greeting each person with a smile, shaking hands, and handing out bulletins. They are also available to answer visitors' questions

and extend extra help in seating those who need assistance.

During the church service, the ushers are responsible to take up the church offering and make sure it is put in the proper place. Ushers also help with the Lord's Supper or Communion. Ushers have a goal of minimizing distractions during the music and sermon. Ushers stand ready to assist anyone in the congregation who might need help, to aid latecomers in finding a seat, and to inform those in the sanctuary of any urgent matters.

Church ushers are well-versed in emergency procedures. In case of an emergency, the ushers will take the lead in getting people to safety in an orderly manner.

Ushers in church aren't just door holders and plate-passers. They serve in a spiritual role and therefore should exhibit some spiritual characteristics.

"Whatsoever ye do, do it heartily, as unto the Lord, and not unto men; knowing that of the Lord ye shall receive the reward of the inheritance: for ye serve the Lord Christ." Colossians. 3: 23.

Ladies Bible Study




As 2024 looms before us, we have no idea what the coming months hold for us. Thankfully the Lord knows. This past year we







WHAT IS INTERCESSORY PRAYER?



It is the act of praying for other people. The Lord instructed us to pray not only for our own personal needs but to reach out and pray for others as well. We find an example of this in 1 Timothy 2:1-6 where we are told to pray and to make intercession for all men.

We received greater amounts of donations so we were able to give more and people started handing out more gift bags to our community.



January and February we were blessed to receive many donations of blankets, clothing, bibles, granola bars and food donations. We did lunches, snacks, gift bags and we distributed to all that were in need in Prince Albert. We did a little clip on 100 Huntley Street, which was really exciting.

March, April and May we traveled to other communities to share the hope of Jesus. We gave food hampers, and we started making gift bags at the church for everyone to hand out. We have given out over 300 so far. Other churches have offered help and came alongside of us to help distribute food.

June, July and August are months that I worry about our vulnerable children but again we had help from First Peoples. We gave out food hampers, had games and craft in the park days, we had splash park days with hotdogs and fruit. We had about 125 children each time we did things which was so good. We cooked at a couple of camps again this year and we traveled. We helped cook, sing and pray with so many people who suffered losses in each communitythey were happy to see us. Another big highlight is that 100 Huntley Street came to Prince Albert to hear our story about our outreach and we had a few people from Crossroads that came out to help and Pastor Thomas came to help pray for our homeless. It was an amazing day.

September, October and November, once again we reached out to collect school supplies, coats, mitts, water bottles. And we need to say a huge thank you to S.H.A.R.E. and United Calvary Church for always helping and going above and beyond for us.

October, we lost a very good friend that did our story on Tribal Trails, Milin Lau. She was a big part of our outreach and was always willing to come out with us, she was a true servant of God. We will miss her.

December, our biggest month, we gave out 500 plus hampers, fed over 900 with our Christmas Feast, and a big thank you to all that cooked turkeys for the feast.





This year I have shed tears of happiness and sadness, felt compelled to give more and seen our children grow more in wanting to give. I have seen our church family willing to hand out gifts and to really feel the blessing of giving. We have so many people to thank, but we give all the glory to God!!

We cannot wait to see what 2024 will bring, hopefully many more changes.

Food Pantry Ministry



Many times, we can experience advantages in life that we take for granted like regular meals, shelter, and clean water, These are basic expectations for some; however, in reality there are so many people who find themselves struggling to make ends meet, and acquire basic necessities due to a financial crisis or other emergencies. As we experience different cultures and lifestyles, we can understand how fortunate we are to have the simple basics in life. Many people who are struggling in life are just right around the corner in our community. Our mission as a church is to provide for those who are in need and our church food pantry can be a very helpful local resource for individuals and families who need help in that area. Crossroads has offered our food pantry ministry to our church family and our community for many years. It has been a solid and practical effort to show the love of Jesus through an act of meeting basic human needs and

offering the love and hope of Christ to our community. We are motivated by our faith to serve people by providing non-perishable food items to individuals and families that come to our church for help. We also make time to listen to their stories and show them that we care. Crossroads food pantry does not turn away those who are not members of our congregation. Instead, we welcome everyone who is in need of help feeding their families. Due to the economic challenges this past year, families in need in our community have continued to grow. We were able to help 36 families in 2023, with an average of ten to fifteen families per month. Our primary goal is to provide food for hungry people in an effort to show the love of Jesus and to open doors for a deeper relationship. We also provide information about church youth ministry. children's ministry and more. Every bag of food that is given includes printed materials inviting people to connect in the life of the church if they so desire.

Our food pantry exists because of your generosity. We would like to THANK each one of you for supporting our Food Pantry Drive last October 2023. We were able to fill 3 grocery carts. Through your support we are able to both physically and spiritually continue to bless others, extend and share God's love to our community. Our pantry accepts donations of a variety of non-perishable items/goods: The items that

we are in constant need are: cereals, granola bars, oats, rice, honey, fruit jams or jellies, peanut butter, canned meat or fish, canned peas, canned beans, canned corn, canned fruits, tomato soup, mushroom soup, chicken noodle soup, hamburger helper, pasta, spaghetti, Kraft dinner, juice, dish soap, etc.

We also gratefully accept personal care items like: soap, toilet paper, shaving cream, deodorant, toothpaste, feminine hygiene, shampoo, etc.

Donations can be made by leaving items in a bin by the foyer each Sunday or at the church office during normal hours of operation (Monday to Friday from 9:00 am to 5:00 pm). The food pantry is supported by faithful individual donations.

It remains a privilege to anticipate helping out young families when they have new bundles of blessings join their family! Last year we were able to bless Petros and Selam, first time parents of a healthy baby boy, Buruk, through this ministry by supporting them when their new baby

had arrived. They came from Egypt and just arrived in Canada in June of 2023. Because of the culinary differences we opted to support them by giving them grocery money for them to make culturally appropriate meals with. Again, thank you for continuing to be a part of this ministry and following Christ's example by loving and caring for one another. Your commitment to helping to fulfill basic needs of families shows your concern and make their adjustment to a new baby a little easier!

Meals for New Moms operates on a volunteer basis and can always use more people to help. This is such a tangible example of sharing God's love, care and help to our church community during an exciting, yet stressful time in their lives!

Crossroads Leadership is so encouraged by the heart for mission so visibly demonstrated throughout our congregation. As the church treasurer, I have confidently stated many times that when our congregation is made aware of a need – you can absolutely count on them to respond. We've continued to support missions abroad both on a regular basis and per need basis, but as inflation continues to rise locally, leadership have also responded by placing increased importance on missions here in our community and country.

In 2023, your generosity enabled us to send:

- Rod Corcoran, missionary in Estonia -\$500 per month and an additional \$650 love offering during his visit to Canada.
- ERDO ChildCare Plus \$100 per month
- Crisis Pregnancy Center \$100 per month. This contribution was being sent to the Winnipeg location. The church board has discontinued donations to this worthy cause effective February 2024 while we endeavor to find a way to support expectant parents in crisis closer to our community.
- Living Waters Camp received \$250 per month and we forwarded an additional donation that was designated to the camp bringing the camp total to \$3500 in 2023. In October, Crossroads also donated the venue for a supper and silent auction fundraiser that was planned and executed by the staff and leadership of Living Waters Camp. In previous years, we had previously enjoyed hosting extra fundraisers such as the Country Gospel Music night, coin collection Sunday challenges and the especially famous Taco in a Bag/Smoothie events which also benefited LWC. We're hoping a few of those options make it back onto our calendar again this year.
- Yorkton Dream Centre, under the leadership of Rev. Kevin Sawatsky, received \$350 per month throughout 2023. In December, the board received a letter from the dream centre informing us that they are now well

- established in the community and suggested we redirect those funds to another cause in 2024.
- Teen Challenge. As addictions is a prominent issue in our community, last year we donated \$250 per month to each the women's and men's centers for a total of \$6000.
- Samaritan Christmas Shoe boxes. Our congregation generously filled and donated approximately 25-30 boxes for Christmas 2023.
- We have frequently mentioned Bonita Abrams, PAOC Missionary in Cuba and all the incredible work being done in that country. Crossroads took up a special offering and sent \$590 last year, and our Ladies Bible Study as well as Kings Kids collected and sent almost \$1000 each that was also sent to Bonita for a grand total of almost \$2500 for God's work in Cuba.
- In July, we had special speaker Dwayne Flamand Jr and his wife Lovejoy come share their testimony and were able to bless them with almost a \$1000 love offering to encourage them as they continue to seek out and minister to those struggling with addictions and depression.
- Our Thanksgiving offering was designated to our local women's shelter and the Homeward Bound program. Each of those worthy charities received \$553 in 2023.
- We lightly topped up the Valentine's Tea and Jewelry sale, organized by Jude Brass and a wonderful team of volunteers to give an even \$1000 to the Riverside school feeding program in February of 2023.
- In June of 2023, we learned that after many years of waiting - our sponsor family was scheduled to arrive within the month. The process to bring Bereket's brother to Canada was initiated in 2019 under almost an entirely different leadership team. The paperwork was filed and then there was no further information regarding the status of the application until we learned of their scheduled arrival. In the wait, Bereket's brother (Petros) had married his now wife, Selam, and they were expecting their first child. We are grateful for the support and education we received regarding our role in their transition into Canada from our PAOC National Office. Crossroads ensured the standards set by the federal government were met immediately upon their arrival, and we have supported them financially on a monthly basis and will continue to provide support for their first year in Canada.

- Shortly before baby's due date, the ladies of Crossroads gathered for the first baby shower we've done in quite awhile. Thanks to your generosity, we were able to ensure they had all the necessary items to welcome baby Buruk. Upon his arrival, you generously blessed them with an extra love offering in lieu of Canadian cuisine. When they notified us they had gotten their first apartment, leadership were all so blessed by the way the congregation came together to create a beautiful first home for them. They are currently working hard to get settled in Canada and will be starting English classes soon. Petros is also eager and motivated to find steady employment. Please keep their family in prayer and if you are willing to contribute financially or with your time, we welcome your continued involvement.
- And finally, Crossroads has continued to rise to the challenge and really went above and beyond again at Thanksgiving to help fill our food pantry. With soaring food costs, we have experienced a substantial increase in the amount of people reaching out on a regular basis for support with food donations. On average, we field approximately 15 requests for assistance each month and there are now other community organizations that refer those in need to our doors. We are so grateful to be able to meet their needs on your behalf. In 2023, thanks to Cathy Crane and her ministry partners, we expanded the food pantry ministry to be able to accommodate additional requests for items such as mittens, scarves, blankets and ministry resources such as bibles and children's books. We also piloted a project where we pre-assembled bags of necessities and gave them to congregants to have at the ready for distribution from their vehicles or near their homes. Bags included warm weather gear, shelf stable food, and a small gift certificate for some warm coffee. On our first run, more than 40 bags were sent out for distribution throughout the city. Your continued generosity has allowed us the opportunity to serve many in the name of Jesus and we are grateful for your support.


Living Waters Camp is owned and operated by the Pentecostal Assemblies of Canada, Saskatchewan District (skpaoc.com).

Children's Ministry



Children's Ministries is our umbrella description for our nursery and children's church programs. The nursery serves children aged newborn through three years old. Children's church is for children aged four through eight.

In the classroom we are continuing to utilize the "Gospel Project" curriculum. We recently purchased some new Bibles for children who don't have their own Bibles and are working hard to get back to the basics of how to navigate our Bibles and what it says by studying the contents in chronological order. Each unit, we also focus in on a core doctrine to help us really discover why we believe what we believe in order to equip our children to live in an increasingly agnostic culture.

Over the past few years, the challenges faced by most families have highlighted the importance of not just children's ministry, but family ministry. In ideal situations, the church gets an average of forty hours per year to influence the children who walk through our doors. Parents get an average of three thousand hours in the same year to influence their children. These last few years have been less than ideal, and today's parents are busier than ever and generally unsure how to intentionally point their kids to Jesus. It's important we equip families to incorporate faith discussions into our day to day lives.

Deuteronomy 6:6-7 tells us,

"6These commandments
that I give you today are
to be on your hearts.

Impress them on your
children. Talk about them
when you sit at home and
when you walk along the road,
when you lie down
and when you get up."

God's intention is for parents to be the primary faith influencer and the church to come alongside in community. As we look forward and plan for the future, it has quickly become our priority to not just nurture and minister to the children who walk through our doors but to really invest in the entire family. Having parents model a healthy faith and reliance on Jesus is far more effective in discipling a child than the best curriculum money could ever buy. In the main hallway, next to our children's church classroom - we have utilized our bulletin boards to provide helpful connection point resources for families. We've also created some posters that point parents towards some of our favorite resources available for purchase. As our church family, I'd love to encourage each of you to please go over our church directory and pray for these young families on a regular basis. Make sure to reach out and let them know you're praying for them and encourage them.



Our church nursery got an amazing facelift at the end of 2023. A huge thank you to Debbie, Blaine, and Molly Johnson for the many hours they invested in patching, repairing, and painting the nursery as well as adding the most amazing murals on the freshly painted walls. The toys have been culled and cleaned and the nursery is ready to welcome our youngest members. We're still finishing the final few

steps of upgrading the nursery washroom and we are excitedly believing we're going to see this space filled soon. An extra big thank you to Debbie Johnson who has volunteered to in the nursery faithfully for the last couple years. We are also grateful for many of the youth in the church who happily volunteer to assist in the nursery when required.



I am extremely grateful to each of my children's ministry volunteers. We are grateful to have added a few more teachers in this classroom as well and are currently still looking for additional teaching assistants to help provide supervision on Sunday mornings. If you want to make a difference in the world, make a difference in the life of a child. Please consider volunteering in children's ministries.

Additionally, the church leadership recognize the importance of involving kids in every aspect of our church experience as they are our future leaders. Youth are faithfully serving the younger children in nursery; they are serving as ushers and regularly serve in worship ministry and technology. We are so blessed and encouraged by their commitment, dedication, and leadership.

Junior Youth has come to be defined as our Sunday morning youth group in the absence of mid-week ministries. This group is ministered to primarily by Molly Johnson and Lyle and Angela Demerais. In September, we were excited to add Karen Ferguson-Dodge back in as a teacher with her husband, Aaron assisting. And starting soon, we will also be adding Aileen Abramyk to our roster of teachers. We are extremely grateful for their ongoing commitment and involvement in this ministry. This group is primarily designed for youth aged 9 through 14, but current attendance allows for senior youth (up to the age of 18) to join and participate if they choose to. Last year we shared that based on the surveys completed within the church in 2022, we decided against bringing back mid-week gatherings following covid restrictions. Attendance at midweek ministries has been steadily declining even prior to covid as society continues to get busier and sports demand


a much larger commitment than they once did. This is not saying that sports are the enemy, it is simply acknowledging that culture has shifted, and we maybe need to think outside the box as to how we're going to reach people. Alternative suggestions included hosting a quarterly family outreach event such as nerf nights, baking challenges, games night, etc. We'd love to hear your feedback if this is an option that would appeal to your family. Church leadership are also looking to invest more in equipping parents to disciple their kids. Many parents did not have the privilege of growing up in homes where faith was modeled as a way of life, and we want to make it as simple as possible for them to continue pointing their children to Jesus. In the classroom, this class has continued to utilize the "Gospel Project" curriculum. It's a Christcentered, chronological Bible study curriculum that helps kids and adults alike study the Bible in an age-appropriate way.

WHAT DOES PROVERBS 22:6 REALLY MEAN?

As we study, we examine a core doctrine each week to equip students to process what we believe and why so they in turn can live God's truth confidently in an increasingly agnostic culture. We look forward to investing in each of the junior youth entrusted to us and encouraging them to grow and really own their faith. If you have a youth aged 9 through 14, we'd love to have them join us! Senior Youth continue to meet Friday evenings at the church and generally average an attendance of around 12 - 20 youth each week. We are grateful to have several students from outside our congregation attend regularly.

Last year we utilized several small units of curriculum published by "Ministry to Youth" and "Download Youth Ministry". We started September with a series on the beatitudes and adjusting our attitudes. It was then nearing the end of October, so we did a couple lessons on fear and the monster inside us which tied into some interesting discussions about Halloween. In November we did a great series on how God speaks to us and then moved into some Christmas themed series discussing how the people of Israel waited anxiously for the coming Messiah and how we should just as excitedly be awaiting His return. We enjoyed our Christmas party and did a gingerbread decorating contest as part of our evening. We started January by digging into Proverbs and discussing wisdom in depth. We then stayed in Proverbs but moved onto discussing friendship and influence, followed by a series on evangelism. As spring approached, we did a series on "filters" and how they may help hide our blemishes and mistakes, but they also mute the beauty that lies beneath. We then did a short series challenging the students to decide whether they want to continue with God and what that might look like. We finished our year with a series on how God uses us and our mistakes, and a series on rest and the sabbath. One of my favorite things about this group is that they are eager and willing to share what they are struggling with which often helps us decide what we're going to lean into next. In the coming year, we're hoping to learn a bit

more about what other religions believe and why we can have confidence in our choice to follow the one true God.

This June, we had the biggest group of graduates Crossroads has seen in quite some time. We were able to honor each of them and their accomplishments during a special Sunday service. They each received a Filament enabled Bible and we also gave each family the book, "Praying the Scriptures for your Adult Children" by Jodi Berndt and reminded the congregation as well that our children, students, and young adults need our continued prayer and support.

We planned to continue meeting socially over the summer. We kicked off summer vacation by meeting to do an escape room challenge. Update from the TREASURER

Remember this: Whoever sows sparingly will also reap sparingly, and whoever sows generously will also reap generously.

I'd like to start by offering a huge thank you to all of you for your faithfulness and obedience in giving. Your faithful giving allows us to support ministries that have a global impact for Christ as well as ministering to our local community.

I've been the treasurer for Crossroads for 16 years now. I was blessed to assume the position while the church was in a solid and positive position. Despite several large challenges since then, the church has remained debt free for the entirety of the time I've done the bookkeeping. All glory goes to God for that amazing accomplishment and the generous contributions of time, talent and resources from our church family and surrounding community. Our budgeting process has been a bit wild for the last couple years as we've faced increased costs for predominantly insurance and utilities, and anticipated larger one-time costs such as pastoral search expenses and this year we celebrated a huge milestone for Crossroads - our 100 year anniversary. As churches continue to close at an alarming rate, we are humbled and grateful for God's continued provision through his faithful servants. As we enter 2024, we pray and continue to trust that God knows our need and will continue to supply through the faithfulness of His people.



Crossroads has endeavored to provide a wide variety of digital giving options to make donating as convenient and easy as possible. We currently offer "Tithely" to process credit card donations. Tithely is a digital platform that can be logged into over the internet from your home computer, or you can use it via an app that is available for iPhone and Android. When you open the application or website for the first time, you'll be prompted to create an account using your contact information, as well as an email address. When you've confirmed your account, you'll be able to link a credit card to your account. From the home page, you'll search for Crossroads Pentecostal Assembly. Once you've selected our church, you'll be able to specify the amount and where you would like the funds designated. There are options available if you'd like to cover the cost of the credit card processing fees, and you also have an option to setup automated giving using your credit card. The credit card processing fee is 2.9% + 0.30/transaction. If you choose to cover the cost of the credit card processing fees, you will also be receipted for that amount.

We also offer pre-authorized debits. This service allows donors to automate their giving through pre-authorized withdrawals from your bank account. Providing this option to our congregation was a little pricier up front but becomes more cost effective as more people utilize it. There are forms available in the office or via email for those who are interested in automated giving. When you fill in the form, you'll select the amount you'd like to give and your withdrawal date. Crossroads recognizes the benefits of automated giving. Automated giving allows us to budget more accurately and smooths out traditional dips in finances due to the inability to attend church in person. It also allows the donor to set a giving goal and meet it without any challenges.

Finally, we also offer the convenience of accepting e-mail money transfers. This has been by far our most utilized form of giving over the course of the last year. Email money transfers can be sent to:

OR we recently created a separate email account specific to that purpose, so money transfers can be sent to:

payments@crossroadspa.ca

We are registered for auto-deposit so most donors will not be required to set up a password by their bank. If you have any other questions about any of these options, I'd be happy to answer them for you. A friendly reminder that even when utilizing electronic giving options, designating your funds is available and encouraged and we are diligent in sending your funds where you request they be sent. The general designation is to be used for your general tithing and offerings. Other designations include missions, building projects, women's ministries, King's Kids, or youth. We are also able to forward funds to Teen Challenge, Horizon College & Seminary, Living Waters Camp, ERDO, Watoto Children's Choir, and our local Christian radio channel. In Tithely, there is a drop-down menu available to designate your offerings. The default selection is set to "tithe". You can select designations when initially setting up your pre-authorized debits, and you can designate funds when e-transferring by utilizing the memo field. Undesignated funds are added to the general fund.

I'm at the church on Tuesday's and Thursday's and I am more than happy to answer any questions you may have on my personal phone number as well. It's a pleasure being involved in our church team and may God bless each of you.




