
FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK...

Added six additional members since reports printed. Acknowledged Debbie Johnson, Maurice/Angie Kasun, Norman Domoslai, Toni Nelson.







- Donating metal chairs to district (150 of them).
- Mary Campbell took the microphone. Acknowledged Bruce Barrowclough contributions to building maintenance. Henry needs help now – board has approved hiring Helen Black and she has accepted the position.
- Resolution to Article 7 Leadership Resolution distributed to those in attendance for review. Laurie Domoslai moved the resolutions, Cathy Crane seconded the motion. Questions:7 – does it include the pastor? No, it is seven voting members. Pastor Hope indicated that he feels passionately that the board should always be an odd number so that the pastor does not need to cast the deciding vote. Ann-Marie asked for clarification – the pastor DOES NOT vote. M/S/C
- Bylaw 2.3.4 Term of Office. The amendment is that the new board will accept terms after being elected. Khami asked for clarification regarding serving one or two consecutive terms, then a break does the clock reset? Yes, if there's been a break you the timer starts over again and you are eligible to serve six years again. Dave Dennis asked about *how*? Pastor Doug Hope stated he suggested casting lots, but its ultimately up to the new board to decide how to assign terms. Maurice asked why the terms weren't going to election. Chelsey clarified that this isn't a normal scenario in that we had all board positions expire at the same time once we get the ball rolling again, you will vote for the person and the term. Laurie Domoslai moved, Art Kun seconded, M/S/C
- New Business Proxy vote (or absentee) votes. Dave Dennis moved; Cathy Crane seconded. Rev. Doug Hope explained what a proxy vote is and the appropriate procedure is and how they are to be counted. Diana Wooden asked for clarification regarding what is acceptable – it's not just because they don't want to come, it needs to be necessary circumstances.

■ Election of board members. After passing the above resolutions, there is no longer an election necessary. Board Members: Dr. Khami Chokani, Cathy Crane, Dave Dennis, Randy Watchman, Marvin Sinitoski, Diana Wooden, Rey Idmilao - Motion to accept board by acclimation – Dave Olsen moved, Faye Hoppe seconded, M/S/C

Rev Hope explained the arms length definition given by Revenue Canada. Also read the directors/trustees definition by Revenue Canada. Chelsey and Mary withdrew their names to avert any potential issues. As such, the previous board agreed to appoint Chelsey to act as the board secretary/ treasurer, and Mary as programme coordinator — they will continue to attend board meetings and weigh in. They simply do not have a vote when it comes to passing a motion.

Diana added a personal note saying how encouraged she was that there was such an increase in interest in serving on board and new memberships. 20 nominations, 18 approved names. Very positive.

Evang asked about who approves the pastor. Pastor Doug read out handout he had prepared for the board listing the steps in preparing for a new pastor.

We thank Pastor Doug for his work.



We found out from Craig Tobin, the Technical Support Supervisor in Calgary assigned to us that the internal battery inside the computer was already dying. This holds the internal time when the computer loses power. When the computer lost its power because the battery was dead when it came back on, it was set to the year 2015. This will always happen because the software goes by the clock so it will not display the ads as the date was outside of the schedule. So every time we experience a power interruption this will definitely happen repeatedly until we address the problem.

Their first suggestion was to send them the computer box in Calgary and they will change the battery for us and the sign would be down for at least a few days. The estimate cost would be under \$200 for the battery/labor/shipping back to us or they will send the battery to us and we can take it to a repair shop here in PA to have it fixed.




Fortunately they ended up sending us the battery FREE of CHARGE and Dave Dennis volunteered to replace the battery for us and have the LED SIGN running.

Come NOVEMBER, the same thing happened the computer was showing the year 2015 again and our tech support in Calgary was able to resync the time via online connection. Twice this JANUARY we had an incident where the Date/Time/ Temp slide froze. I did report the problem to Craig, this time he said that he can't see the computer system online. If it froze on a slide the computer has to be rebooted. What I did was to turn off the sign's computer box, unplug the big and small box in my office and turn off the switch from the main switch board in the mechanical room. What happened was our LED sign computer took some time to grab the Date/Time/Temp slide once it is power cycled. Fortunately, we were able to fix the problem but we were advised to make the necessary upgrades in the near future to keep it in good running condition. Their suggestion is for us to invest in a UPS system where we can plug the sign's computer into so it keeps it running on battery during an outage. We will keep you all posted.

Technology Report



Technology. It evolves faster than most of us could begin to comprehend. If I had to pick a saying that encapsulated our approach to technology in the past, it would probably be "if it ain't broke, don't fix it". God has been especially good to us in rebuking the devourer from the assets we have been blessed with and protecting us from ever increasing digital threats. However, we've postponed several upgrades long enough that when one item fails, it often leads to a domino effect of technological fails. Throughout the building, we upgraded our main phone system to support interoffice connection and add a variety of features such as options for direct lines and voicemail systems, scheduling, call forwarding and more. There's literally a manual to learn how they operate but myself and Marivic have LOVED the extra functionality.

We separated our network for privacy purposes and have added additional security and backups for our files. My computer in the office was hugely upgraded and switched up to allow me to be more mobile. That switch freed up one of the two laptops utilized by Children and Youth Ministries for the SMART boards, so we were able to upgrade and utilize that unit in the library. We're grateful for the support and expertise of Kyle Erickson, IT specialist, as we endeavor to catch up on the technology front.

Thanks to several investments in our soundroom during 2021, we're generally able to provide a decent live stream for those of our congregation who are unable to join us in person for a variety of reasons and our livestream has also provided some unique outreach opportunities. Despite the many advancements, participating virtually will never completely replace the experience of attending in person. And really, that's a good thing. It's a wonderful option when we're feeling unwell or are away travelling. But it's hard to really belong to a church when we consume it from the comfort of our homes. To create our current livestream, we upgraded the computer we use for the livestream and added a "switcher" that acts as the processing unit and allows us to

switch feeds seamlessly while we are live. We've got two great cameras with decent zoom that allow us a little bit of creativity in our presentation. The soundroom is currently a bit tight and we've got those cameras set up on regular tripods. Those of you who watch the livestream regularly have likely noticed random camera shakes which easily occur if anyone even shifts their weight while working on the platform. It's a work in progress, but we're excited for how far we've come already. We're very grateful to Randy for the hours he's invested in learning the craft of balancing the sound as well as managing the livestream, and it's great to have Ken Wooden back sitting behind the board as well. Marivic and I are both pinch hitters in the event of an emergency. There are a handful of people who have indicated interest in learning how to do the sound and live stream. There will hopefully be training sessions added to the calendar soon. If you have not previously spoken to Randy but would be interested in volunteering in this fast paced, engaging opportunity - please see him to add your name to the training list. Chelsey

The role of a church usher is to help your guests and members experience the sacredness and joy of worshipping God.

THE PURPOSE OF THE SERVICE

The church usher role is one of many different roles in the system of church hospitality. They help create a great hospitality experience that your first time church visitor or long term member will have on a given day.

The purpose of ushering in church is not merely to serve people, as in a theater or restaurant. Its purpose is to serve God. When the ushers see to it that an atmosphere of reverence and order is maintained before, during, and after the service, they do it for God. When they usher the worshippers to their seats, they do it for God. When they gather the offerings, they serve God. What they do, they do not "as unto men, but unto God." They are a part of the total congregation which presents itself before God to worship Him.

DON'T Regard ushering in church as a mere mechanical necessity to direct people to their pews, or a social function which church custom considers desirable. The whole congregation, and particularly the ushers, must have the right mental attitude for the work of ushering. Otherwise it loses its sacred character and will not accomplish its real purpose. All ushers must have the right mental attitude. Their motto must be, "We serve the Lord Christ."

The ushers are the representatives of the church to the people who come to worship there. Visitors receive their first impression of the church from the ushers. And that impression may be the deciding factor in making a visitor a regular worshipper, or of causing him to go elsewhere of winning or losing a soul to Christ and the church.


Ladies Bible Study



2022 started off on a better foundation, although there was still some trials and tests with covid still being a major problem. The Tait family, Gary Quequish and family, Tribal Trails for helping us voice our needs, Save On Foods and Coop.

January and February we received many donations of blankets, clothing, and food hampers that we were able to give to families, people on our streets and to some of the schools. We were out feeding soup and bannock, snacks, fruit and hot beverages.





We traveled to other communities to share the hope of Jesus, we gave gifts to those who truly needed them.

March, April and May - we gave over 200 food hampers out, books and clothes. We did stew and had other church organizations come out with us to distribute.

June, July and August are months that I really worry about as some of our most vulnerable youth go without, so this year with the help of first peoples we gave more food hampers, had a supply ready to go and had volunteers eager to help with games, crafts. We cooked at camp with an opportunity to share and help others. Some of us still traveled to other communities where we shared the word, helped cook, sing and pray.



September, October, and November - we started collecting school supplies, coats, mitts, toques, and *BIG THANK YOU TO CROSSROADS* . . . we gave a blessing to Kindred spirits from our church and they were so overwhelmed they cried. We were back out on streets with soup and sandwiches, blankets and warmers.

Food Pantry Ministry



Crossroads has offered a food pantry ministry to our church family and our community for many years. It has been a solid and practical effort to show the love of Jesus through an act of meeting basic human needs and offering the love and hope of Christ to our community. We are motivated by our faith to serve people by providing non-perishable food items to individuals and families that come to our church for help. We also make time to listen to their stories and show them that we care.

For a long time, the primary goal was clear: provide food for hungry people. In an effort to show the love of Jesus and to open doors for a deeper relationship, we provide information about church youth ministry, children's ministry and more. Every bag of food that is given includes printed materials inviting people to connect in the life of the church if they so desire.

Due to the economic challenges this past year families in need in our community have continued to grow. Since 2022 we were able to help between eight to twelve families per month. We usually give out one bag per family but also depending upon the number of family members per household.

Our food pantry exists because of your generosity. We would like to THANK each one of you for supporting our Food Pantry Drive last October 2022. We were able to fill 4 grocery carts. Through your support we are able to both physically and spiritually continue to bless others, extend and share God's love to our community.

Crossroads Leadership is so encouraged by the heart for mission so visibly demonstrated throughout our congregation. As the church treasurer, I have confidently stated many times that when our congregation is made aware of a need – you can absolutely count on them to respond. We've continued to support missions abroad both on a regular basis and per need basis, but as inflation continues to rise locally, leadership have also responded by placing increased importance on missions here in our community and country.

In faith, we have committed to send monthly mission support to the following:

- Rod Corcoran, missionary in Estonia -\$500 per month
- ERDO ChildCare Plus \$100 per month
- Crisis Pregnancy Center \$100 per month. This contribution is currently sent to the Winnipeg location, but the church board is currently investigating options to support struggling parents within our community.
- Living Waters Camp received \$175 per month last year. We had previously enjoyed hosting extra fundraisers such as the Country Gospel Music night, coin collection Sunday challenges and the especially famous Taco in a Bag/Smoothie events which also benefited LWC. We're hoping a few of those options make it back onto our calendar again this year, but the board has approved an increase in our monthly support to \$250 per month effective January 2023.
- Yorkton Dream Centre \$350 per month.
- Horizon College & Seminary continued to receive \$350 per month for all of 2022. While establishing the annual budget for 2023, the board made the difficult decision to discontinue monthly support to the college. There were several factors that were considered in the decision, but ultimately the board decided that because addiction is such a huge problem in our

local community, we would like to substantially increase our regular support of Teen Challenge for the coming year. Teen Challenge received \$100 per month last year, plus a generous one-time donation of \$2286.50 from Crossroads congregation during their visit plus an additional \$500 cheque from Crossroads Women's Ministry. For the year 2023, the board has committed to send \$250 per month to each the men's and women's Teen Challenge centers.

- Samaritan Christmas Shoe boxes. Our congregation generously filled and donated approximately 25 boxes for Christmas 2022.
- We have frequently mentioned Bonita Abrams, PAOC Missionary in Cuba and all the incredible work being done in that country. Crossroads sent \$500 last year, and our Ladies Bible Study as well as Kings Kids collected and sent almost \$1000 each that was also sent to Bonita for a grand total of almost \$2500 for God's work in Cuba.
- Due to the crisis in Ukraine, we also took up a special offering and sent an extra \$565 to Rod Corcoran, as well as \$565 to the Pankova family (PAOC Missionaries to Russia) who were displaced due to the ongoing war between Russia and the Ukraine. We were also able to forward \$785 to ERDO who continue to actively minister in that situation.

PAOC/EKNK 2023, here we come! Happy New Year

- In response to the Bangladesh floods, Crossroads congregation sponsored food for 12 families with a donation of \$306.00
- In appreciation of the work done to promote Crossroads through mail-outs to our community, Crossroads gave a \$500 donation to "Every Home for Christ" to continue to support their efforts to reach the lost.

Our special Thanksgiving offering was split between two local organizations. Prince Albert Mobile Crisis and Kindred Spirits (a division of our local YMCA) each received \$1650. Mobile Crisis indicated they planned to use the funds to support our homeless population throughout the winter months, and Kindred Spirits was in tears as this donation allowed them to purchase some much-needed snow suits for the families they were currently working with.



- We were able to forward a cash donation to assist the Chokani family during Khami's health emergency and facilitate sending some meals to the family during Khami's extended hospital stay. As we approach the one-year mark since then, isn't it amazing to marvel at what a miracle we've all witnessed as God has moved powerfully to answer our earnest prayers.
- And finally, Crossroads has continued to rise to the challenge and really went above and beyond at Thanksgiving to help fill our food pantry. With soaring food costs, we have experienced a substantial increase in the amount of people reaching out on a regular basis for support with food donations. We are so grateful to be able to meet their needs on your behalf. In 2023, we are excited to be expanding the food pantry ministry to be able to accommodate additional requests for items such as mittens, scarves, blankets and ministry resources such as bibles and children's books. Children's Ministry



Children's Ministries continues to encompass three groups each Sunday morning. We have a nursery for children aged newborn through three years old. Children's church is for children aged four through eight, and junior youth is for children aged nine through fourteen.

In person children's ministries has now been running faithfully for the past year. We completed our Dig In curriculum and are currently utilizing the "Gospel Project" curriculum. We recently purchased some new Bibles for children who don't have their own Bibles and are working hard to get back to the basics of how to navigate our Bibles and what is says by studying the contents in chronological order. Each unit, we also focus in on a core doctrine to help us really discover why we believe what we believe in order to equip our children to live in an increasingly agnostic culture.

Our shutdown throughout covid has really placed a spotlight on the importance of not just children's ministry, but family ministry. In ideal situations, the church gets an average of forty hours per year to influence the children who walk through our doors. Parents get an average of three thousand hours in the same year to influence their children. These last few years have been less than ideal, and today's parents are busier than ever and generally unsure how to intentionally point their kids to Jesus. It's important we equip families to incorporate faith discussions into our day to day lives. Deuteronomy 6:6-7 (NIV) tells us, "These commandments that I give you today are to be on your hearts. 7 Impress them on your children. Talk about them when you sit at home and when you walk along the road, when you lie down and when you get up." God's intention is for parents to be the primary faith influencer and the church to come alongside in community. As we look forward and plan for the future, it has quickly become our priority to not just nurture and minister to the children who walk

through our doors but to really invest in the entire family. Having parents model a healthy faith and reliance on Jesus is far more effective in discipling a child than the best curriculum money could ever buy. I encourage each of you to please go over our church directory and pray for these young families on a regular basis. Make sure to reach out and let them know you're cheering for them and ready to help.

Additionally, the church leadership recognize the importance of involving kids in every aspect of our church experience as they are our future leaders. Youth are faithfully serving the younger children in nursery; they are serving as ushers and regularly serve in worship ministry and technology. Last year, we also introduced family Sundays. It is our goal to designate at least one Sunday per month as a family Sunday, Children's Church and Junior Youth will remain in the service and families will be encouraged to pray with one another and discuss what they're learning as part of the service. Children will also be invited to lead the congregation in a special song selection.



Nursery has gotten a lot quieter as many of the kids who were using the room have been promoted to and faithfully attend children's church. Prior to covid, the nursery averaged attendance of six children or less per week. Since re-opening nursery ministry, we occasionally have one or two. There are many volunteers who are also not attending regularly which makes scheduling quite a challenge. A huge thank you to Debbie Johnson who has volunteered to in the nursery faithfully for more than a year now. We are also grateful for many of the youth in the church who happily volunteered to assist in the nursery. I am extremely grateful to each of my children's ministry volunteers who are quick to step up when tapped on the shoulder each week. It would definitely help save me a few grey hairs if I had a few more volunteers for a regular rotation or even a few who would consider volunteering on a substitute basis only. If you want to make a difference in the world, make a difference in the life of a child. Please consider volunteering in children's ministries.



In lieu of a new opportunity, we opted not to offer Vacation Bible School in 2022. I (Chelsey) instead, was designated the director of Living Waters Kids Camp for summer of 2021. The church generously offered to help sponsor children to attend camp and it was great to see a handful of our church families seize that opportunity. Despite record breaking heat, the 50+ attendees to kids' camp enjoyed a wonderful weekend. While Living Waters Camp did offer me the opportunity to direct Kids Camp again this year, after much prayer and consultation I ended up declining the leadership role although I will still be nearby and likely involved. As far as summer 2023

goes, no decisions have currently been made. I had purchased a VBS kit that remains unused. However, hosting a VBS requires a LOT of volunteers. If you'd like an opportunity to be involved in a fantastic outreach event, then come speak to me about the many ways you can contribute. Maybe working with kids is too overwhelming for you, but decorating or preparing crafts or shopping is what you love to do? There's lots of ways to get involved – you won't be sorry you did!

I'd love to hear any comments, feedback or suggestions you may have regarding the children's program. I'm currently available at the church on Tuesday and Thursday mornings or you can contact me on my personal phone at any time.



It was a difficult decision but after reviewing the results of our congregational survey and additionally in response to a lack of volunteers, Crossroads leadership has opted to not resume KidZone ministries on Wednesday evenings in 2022. KidZone previously was held on Wednesday evenings from 6:45-8pm and was geared to children aged 4 through 8. We spent time playing in the gym, learned a new praise and worship song each month and we had a lot of fun learning about our heavenly father and how to apply the wisdom of the Bible to our lives. Best of all, this outreach was completely free to attend. The curriculum we currently utilize in our Children's Church classroom has a midweek component available to use in the event there is enough interest expressed to reintroduce this ministry in fall 2023. Kids this age are a critical mission field. Statistics continue to show that more than 80% of people commit their lives to Jesus between the ages of 4 and 14. However, we previously thought that there were an exodus of our youth leaving the church after graduating high school. The newest statistics show we are losing them much earlier than that. Make no mistake, there is a war for these kid's souls, and we need to invest in them and help them develop a



solid biblical foundation and defense for their faith. In response to the cultural shift that makes weekly attendance challenging for families of young children, the board are currently considering hosting quarterly outreach events as an alternative. In December, we hosted a "Gingerbread Bash" outreach event in our gym. Families kicked off the event by playing a game together, then assembled and decorated gingerbread nativities. When they finished, we reviewed the Christmas story and explained how Jesus was the best gift ever and finished off singing a Christmas Carol compilation. The extra fun part of this event was we were able to assemble kits for families who could not join us in person and give them access to a video to follow that they could complete at a convenient time for them. This meant in total we were able to reach over thirty families with the good news about Jesus and what Christmas really means. If you are interested in assisting (even occasionally), please see Chelsey for additional details. Please continue to pray for our church families and church leadership as we endeavor to raise the next generation of leaders for Christ.

Church leadership are also looking to invest more in equipping parents to disciple their kids. Many parents did not have the privilege of growing up in homes where faith was modeled as a way of life, and we want to make it as simple as possible for them to continue pointing their children to Jesus. In September this class also began utilizing the "Gospel Project" curriculum. It's a Christ-centered, chronological Bible study curriculum that helps kids and adults alike study the Bible in an age-appropriate way. As we study, we examine a core doctrine each week to equip students to process what we believe and why so they in turn can live God's truth confidently in an increasingly agnostic culture. We look forward to investing in each of the junior youth entrusted to us



Senior Youth continue to meet Friday evenings at the church and generally average an attendance of around 12 - 20 youth each week. We are grateful to have several students from outside our congregation attend regularly.

Last year we utilized mostly curriculum published by "Ministry to Youth". They had created an annual plan that encouraged youth to KNOW (the foundations of their faith), GROW (become more like Jesus and grow in their faith) and GO (evangelism, sharing their faith and leading others by living out their faith). We really enjoyed the lessons. They were relevant and engaging and the flow worked well. We also supplemented with material from "Download Youth Ministry". They offer a wide range of digital products including curriculum and devotionals, but our favorites are the digital games. We also utilize their social media graphics for our Instagram account. In response to some very interesting conversations in the youth room, we also completed a book study to finish 2022 titled, "How NOT to Read the Bible" written by Dan Kimball. Biblical literacy is a struggle for many believers. As we navigate social media, it is becoming far more common to come across memes that cherry pick verses from the Bible to mock. The scripture reference is accurate, and Christians who are not well prepared often find themselves confused by what they are reading. This book specifically

taught students some fundamental points about how to approach these topics, how to accurately interpret these scriptures and broke down the arguments surrounding a few culturally hot topics. It was a very enjoyable study which will be added to our church library shortly for those of you interested in checking it out. Beginning January 2023, Download Youth Ministry has expanded their offerings to include curriculum submitted from a variety of well-established youth leaders. As this is a free expansion of the services we were already paying for and utilizing, we are looking forward to introducing some of their series in the coming months and have also been utilizing the church's subscription to RightNow Media.

We planned to continue meeting socially over the summer. We kicked off summer vacation by meeting for an evening of paintball. The youth had requested this MANY times, so we were thrilled to have a great turnout (although a number of youths opted not to attend because paintball is intimidating). There were many laughs and MANY colorful bruises so it will now take them awhile to convince me to go back again. After that we learned, that if it wasn't put on a calendar prior to winding up for the year, it was a challenge to keep in communication with everyone. This year's summer events will be selected and booked prior to May in the hopes that everyone has an option or two to look



forward to. Upon returning in the fall, we had hoped to go roller skating – however the roller rink closed again shortly after it's much anticipated re-opening. We checked into going bowling, however Friday evenings were reserved for league use until after 9pm, and the other suggestion was attempting an escape room. WHO COOKS THE MEALS?


The host will provide the entrée and beverages and everyone brings a dish such as an hors d'oeuvre, a salad, a side dish, bread or a dessert to share.

Update from the TREASURER



I'd like to start by offering a huge thank you to all of you for your faithfulness and obedience in giving. Your faithful giving allows us to support ministries that have a global impact for Christ as well as ministering to our local community.

I've been the treasurer for Crossroads for 15 years now. I was blessed to assume the position while the church was in a solid and positive position. Despite several large challenges since then, the church has remained debt free for the entirety of the time I've done the bookkeeping. All glory goes to God for that amazing accomplishment and the generous contributions of time, talent and resources from our church family and surrounding community. Last year was the first time in many years we indicated some substantial shifts in our annual budget. We budgeted extra for the pastoral search process to cover travel costs and possibly moving costs for a new senior pastor. We were also able to plan and host a very nice retirement celebration for Pastor Ches and Kathy at the beginning of May. Throughout the year we were able to tackle a few of the projects on a growing list of building upgrades the board would like to pursue. Completed projects include cleaning and painting the parking lot, some electrical upgrades and several technology upgrades. In the coming year, we will continue to monitor the budget and hope to continue to invest in maintaining and improving God's house. Thanks to your continued generosity, it was also a joy to be able to bless our community by giving generous donations to both Kindred Spirits and our local Mobile Crisis this fall. Kindred Spirits indicated the gift would be used to provide several much-needed snowsuits for children. Mobile Crisis works hard to ensure those who live on the streets have their basic needs met as well as responding to individuals and families in crisis. They are rarely the recipients of donations. Both recipients were incredibly grateful. As we enter 2023, we pray and continue to trust that God knows our need and will continue to supply through the faithfulness of His people.

Crossroads has endeavored to provide a wide variety of digital giving options to make donating as convenient and easy as possible. We currently offer "Tithely" to process credit card donations. Tithely is a digital platform that can be logged into over the internet from your home computer, or you can use it via an app that is available for iPhone and Android. When you open the application or website for the first time, you'll be prompted to create an account using your contact information, as well as an email address. When you've confirmed your account, you'll be able to link a credit card to your account. From the home page, you'll search for Crossroads Pentecostal Assembly. Once you've selected our church, you'll be able to specify the amount and where you would like the funds designated. There are options available if you'd like to cover the cost of the credit card processing fees, and you also have an option to setup automated giving using your credit card. The credit card processing fee is 2.9% + 0.30/transaction. If you choose to cover the cost of the credit card processing fees, you will also be receipted for that amount.



We also offer pre-authorized debits. This service allows donors to automate their giving through pre-authorized withdrawals from your bank account. Providing this option to our congregation was a little pricier up front, but becomes more cost effective as more people utilize it. There are forms available in the office or via email for those who are interested in automated giving. When you fill in the form, you'll select the amount you'd like to give and your withdrawal date. Crossroads recognizes the benefits of automated giving. Automated giving allows us to budget more accurately and smooths out traditional dips in finances due to the inability to attend church in person. It also allows the donor to set a giving goal and meet it without any challenges.

We are registered for auto-deposit so most donors will not be required to set up a password by their bank. If you have any other questions about any of these options, I'd be happy to answer them for you.



A friendly reminder that even when utilizing electronic giving options, designating your funds is available and encouraged and we are diligent in sending your funds where you request they be sent. The general designation is to be used for your general tithing and offerings. Other designations include missions, building projects, women's ministries, King's Kids, or youth. We are also able to forward funds to Teen Challenge. Horizon College & Seminary, Living Waters Camp, ERDO, Watoto Children's Choir, Yorkton Dream Centre and our local Christian radio channel. In Tithely, there is a dropdown menu available to designate your offerings. The default selection is set to "tithe". You can select designations when initially setting up your pre-authorized debits, and you can designate funds when e-transferring by utilizing the memo field. Undesignated funds are added to the general fund.
